Lately, we've shared information and updates about the Library's Strategic Plan process and upcoming signature programs. By now,

you also know that we are engaged in an early mission to get more library card holders, and people to renew their cards. September is Library Card Sign Up Month. Let's kickstart it today. Talk it up. We know that a library card opens a world of opportunity.

Additionally, opportunities are forged by embracing literacy. Statistics show that since COVID-19 there has been a decline in literacy. Studies continue to be done about children who do not read on grade level; and adults who walk around, functionally illiterate.

The ability to read well suffers from all its complexities such as comprehension; language barriers; and reading and learning disabilities. The Library System assists by offering online resources, resume-writing classes, GED subject classes and testing, as well as ESL classes.

The Library System will again partner with the Georgia Public Library Service on the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten initiative. Primetime Family Reading was a returning project that allowed families ways to get children interested in reading

and meeting the challenges of becoming not just readers, but learners.


In addition to all the work we are doing to address youth literacy, we remain focused on literacy for all ages. Our nearly 20 book clubs across Fulton County are currently reading and discussing the 2023 One Book, One Read selection, The Personal Librarian.
