Also, the Library's ongoing commitment to literacy, digital inclusion and partnerships will be on greater display. The plan is to make the library the place to be with many events happening.

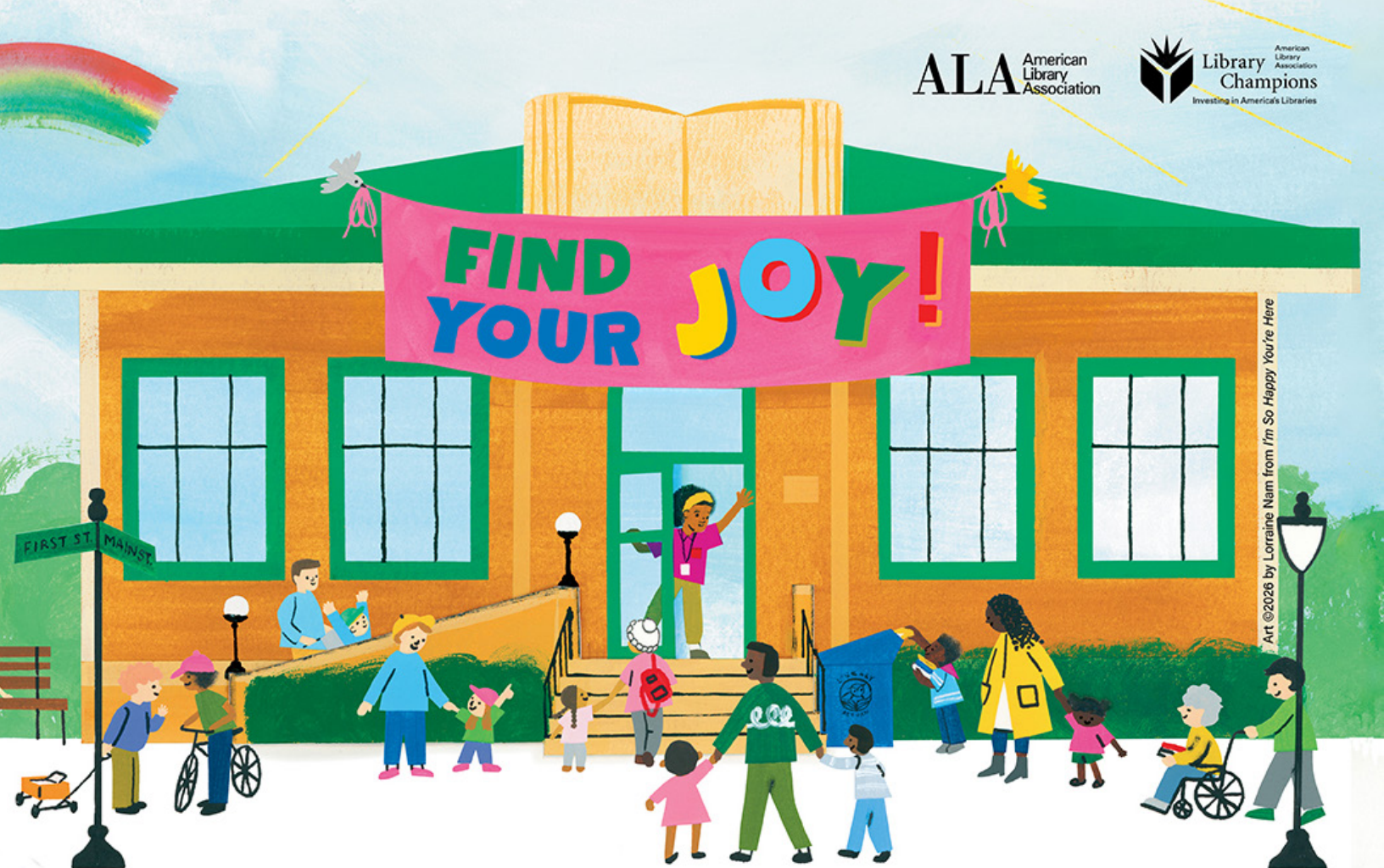

AUTHOR TALK: DR. JELANI COBB

Charis and the Auburn Avenue Research Library welcome Dr. Jelani Cobb in conversation with Errin Haines for a celebration of *Three or More Is a Riot: Notes on How We Got Here*. Cobb's work as a reporter takes readers to the front lines of new social movements—around guns, gender violence, sexual harassment, race, policing, and on and on—and an equally powerful backlash that abetted the rise of the MAGA movement.

CELEBRATING FRIENDSGIVING!

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to learn a new language? What about learning English as a second language? Not sure where to start? The best place to begin your new language journey is your local Fulton County library branch! Most branches offer a variety of beginner language and ESL classes that are free to the public. These courses provide participants a chance to learn a new language in a safe, inviting environment where they learn how to speak effectively and foster a long-lasting connection as the class works together to become familiar with the new language. This connection is enhanced when the group comes together to share food, beverages, and experiences from their own unique cultures with everyone else through a "Friendsgiving Gathering". These typically occur every year around the holidays at several branches. Katie Mildenhall teaches the ESL For Beginners class at the Roswell library and shared, **"This year was our 2nd annual Friendsgiving event! It is a wonderful time to allow the students to engage with one another in a more casual setting. They love trying new foods that their classmates bring and it's also a time for them to share specialties from their home countries."**

These are a few examples of how the library fosters a safe and inviting space for those who wish to learn a new language. Other ESL and foreign language classes across the system also participate in similar programs, such as the Alpharetta and East Roswell Library language classes which also hosted their own Friendsgiving potluck event in the past. It is this type of community involvement that makes volunteer led programs

From employment for teenagers to employment for senior citizens, **WorkSource Fulton** is a great community partner that provides an array of services to help you with your job search by offering the tools, resources and connections that are needed to get started. In current times, there are quite a few grandparents raising their grandchildren and eventually end up feeling overwhelmed with understanding the legal process and the impact this decision may have on their benefits. **Legal Aid Atlanta** launched a new partnership with the Metropolitan branch to offer free legal assistance and resources to grandparents or relative/non-relative caregivers. If you have custody and adoption questions or questions about understanding the impact of adoption on benefits, this would be a great event for you to register to attend.
