Celebrating Our Amazing Volunteers

On Saturday, April 25, during National Volunteer Week 2026, our Volunteer Services Program held the **35th Annual Volunteer Recognition Program** at the Central Library in downtown Atlanta.

We celebrated the 1,861 volunteers who donated over 49,804 hours of service across Fulton County in 2025. Volunteers who served certain thresholds of hours in 2025 were provided awards during the program.

The program was also attended by Fulton County Board of Commissioners Chairman Robb Pitts, District 5 Commissioner Marvin S. Arrington Jr., Fulton County Library Board of Trustees Chair Nina Radakovich, and Vice Chair Beverly R. Rice.

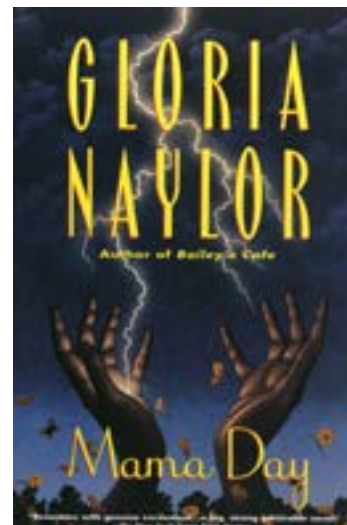


The Auburn Avenue Literary Society Discussion - *Mama Day* by Gloria Naylor
